



What is Girl Power Project?



Just Like My Child Foundation has developed a replicable curriculum and system of delivery that has been scientifically proven to empower vulnerable adolescent girls in the developing world and high-risk environments with the tools they need to stay in school and avoid forced-child marriage, disease, early pregnancy, and gender-based violence. To date, we have reached over 20,000 girls in Uganda, East Africa, aged 12-15 years with our Girl Power Project®. Each girl who goes through Girl Power Project® receives 60+ hours of workshops, camp, and club sessions taught by local mentors over the course of two years. The program is on target to reach girls in India and the Indigenous Native American communities within the United States in 2020 and beyond. It's our collective dream, to bring Girl Power Project® to the world.


Why girls?

Educated women reinvest 90% of their income into their family while men reinvest 30-40%



Every additional year of primary school boosts girls' eventual wages 10%-20% and an extra year of secondary school by 15%-25%

Girls who stay in school during adolescence have a later sexual debut, are less likely to be subjected to forced sex and, if sexually active, are more likely to use contraception than their peers who are out of school





When a girl has 7 or more years of education she marries 4 years later and has 2.2 fewer children.





The introduction of family planning could dramatically impact the climate health of the planet by 51.48 Gigatons of emissions reduced by 2050
